Gordonstoun Beginnings

Gordonstoun was founded in 1934 by German educationalist Dr Kurt Hahn. Soon afterwards he decided that young people across the local area should have the opportunity to experience his uniquely broad educational model and he created the Moray Badge (which HRH The Duke of Edinburgh himself gained as a pupil at the school). Such was the success of this programme that Hahn had ambitions for it to be awarded nationally. He consulted with Prince Philip and persuaded him to give his name to what became the Duke of Edinburgh's Award in 1956.

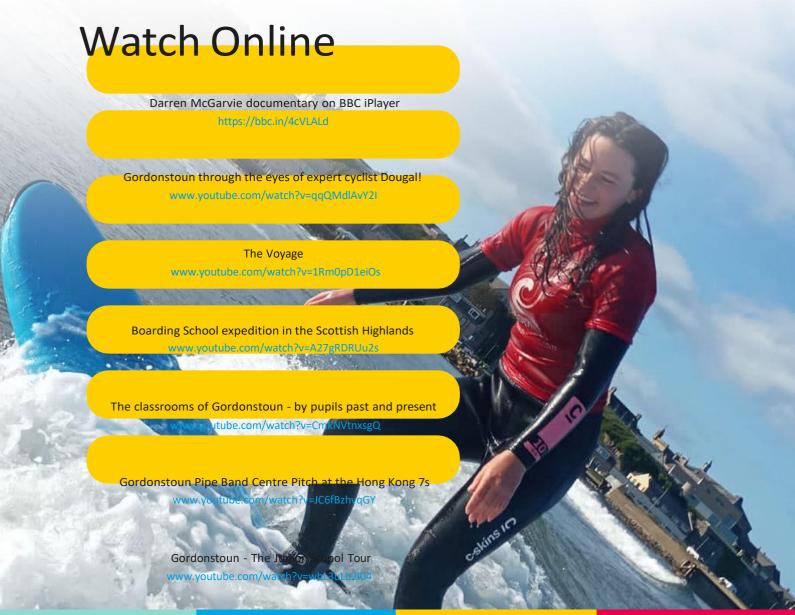
Gordonstoun is committed to offering as many students as possible the opportunity to take advantage of the Gordonstoun education model.

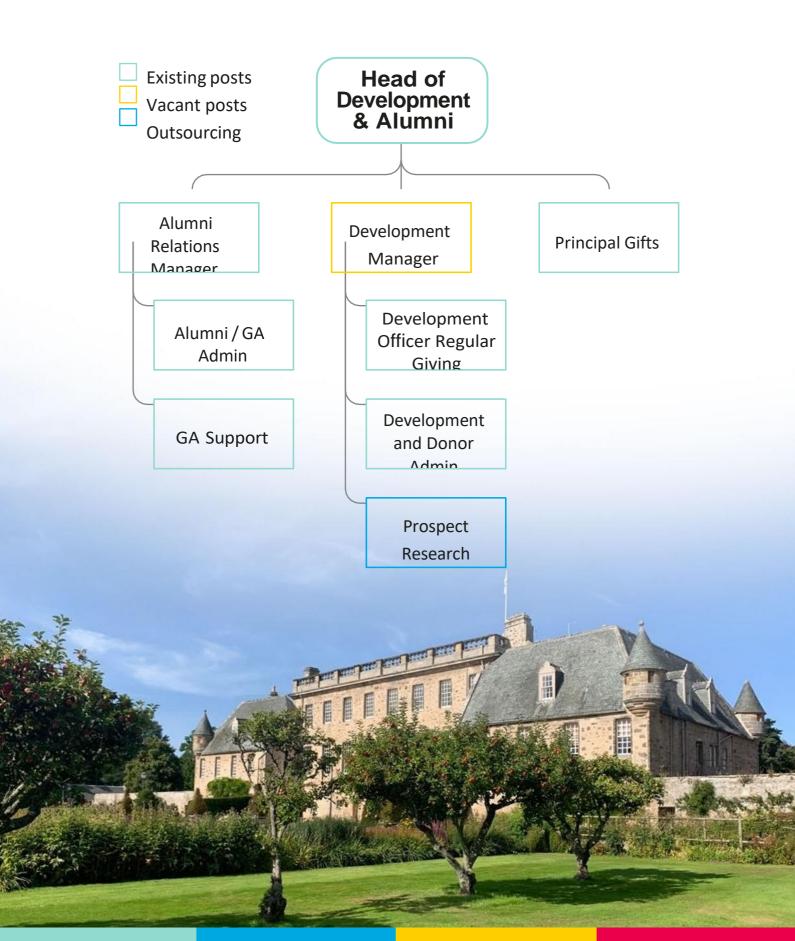

The Opportunity

This is an exciting new role at Gordonstoun. This is a key post within the recently re-structured Development Office and is responsible for the generation of fundraising income for key School initiatives that reflect and support the main strategic objectives of the institution.

You will develop and manage the major gifts regular giving programmes — including the telephone campaign, identifying, developing and managing a portfolio of prospects, including individuals, trusts and foundations and other statutory funding bodies with the aim of raising philanthropic income including legacy pledges.

In addition, you will have a strong working knowledge of fundraising CRM systems and the ability to manage and extrapolate data as it relates to the successful management of all fundraising activities.
